## Career

11.1873:	Launched.
1873:	Purchased for £26,500 after completion, to be a coal, stores and cargo carrier; arguably P&O's first real cargo ship.
02.12.1873:	Registered as <i>Adria</i> for The Peninsular and Oriental Steam Navigation Company. Adria is a town and ancient port in northeast Italy.
24.12.1873:	Left builders for Southampton and Alexandria. Though intended to be employed in the Far East where P&O was experimenting with Japanese and Formosan coal supplies, she was initially used as an extra vessel for two voyages on the Alexandria/Venice service.
01.03.1875:	Return voyage Hong Kong/Cookstown/Sydney.
03.12.1880:	Made what was probably a pilgrim voyage Bombay/Aden/ Hodeida/ Jeddah/Yenbo/Tor/Suez, returning via Jeddah, Hodeida, Aden and Karachi.
18.05.1881:	Return voyage Hong Kong/Saigon.
12.1881:	Sold for £3,337/16/2d, because she was underpowered and needed new boilers and other repairs, to Hajee Cassum Joosub, Bombay.
06.05.1886:	Wrecked off Pemba when en route from Bombay and Mauritius to Zanzibar with general cargo and 123 passengers.

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
