21.05.1951:	Launched by Miss G Simon, daughter of J G Simon, British India Steam Navigation Company's Managing Director.
11.09.1951:	Delivered as <i>Chakdina</i> for the British India Steam Navigation Company Ltd. She was the tenth ship of the 13-strong C-class delivered to the company.
24.03.1952:	Mined off Terschelling (53°31'N-05°06'E). Fortuna tely the damage was only minor and she was able to reach port for repairs.
07.10.1964:	Suffered a minor fire in the cotton-waste cargo while berthed in Victoria Dock at Melbourne but it was brought under control after three hours.
01.10.1971:	Management transferred to P&O General Cargo Division.
19.04.1973:	Ownership transferred to The Peninsular and Oriental Steam Navigation Company.
25.10.1975:	Renamed Strathlairg.
07.1976:	Dry-docked at Auckland to repair a leak in her hull.
17.08.1977:	Sold to Lieng Hung Steel Enterprise Company Ltd, Taiwan.
19.08.1977:	Arrived at Kaohsiung.
24.10.1977:	Demolition commenced.

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
