01.07.1974:	Four sister ships ordered for P&O Bulk Shipping Division from Thyssen Nordseewerke, Emden, West Germany - P&O's largest shipbuilding order to date (£75 million) and the largest yet accepted by the builders. <i>Galpara</i> was the second of the class to be delivered, after <i>Garinda</i> , before <i>Galpara</i> and <i>Garala</i> – 'Galpara' is derived from Goalpara, a town and district on the river Jamuna in Assam, north- east India and a name previously carried by three cargo liners of the British India Steam Navigation Company.
04.06.1977:	Launched.
09.03.1978:	Named by Mrs Noel Graham, wife of Rear Admiral Bill Graham, Secretary General of the International Chamber of Shipping.
31.03.1978:	Delivered as <i>Galpara</i> for Orient Steam Navigation Company Ltd (P&O Bulk Shipping Division, managers).
03.1980:	Cargo capacity amended to 54,226 cubic metres (1,915,262 cubic feet).
03.1981:	Managers and operators renamed P&O Deep Sea Cargo Division.
23.06.1982:	Port side damaged while berthing at Hulva, requiring dry docking for repairs.
1983:	Management transferred to P&O Bulk Shipping Ltd.
03.05.1985:	Sold to Galpara Gas Carriers Ltd (Overseas Shipholding Group, Bermuda). Operated by P&O Gas Carrier Ltd (owned 50:50 by P&O and OSG). Managed by P&O Ship Management Ltd.
03.10.1986:	Sold to Sayle Co Ltd (Rederiet Helge R Myhre A/S, managers), Bermuda.
09.02.1987:	Renamed Havdrott.
1993: 1996:	Managers Havtor Management A/S, Oslo. Owners Partrederiet Bergesen d.y. Shipping D A, Oslo, Managers Bergesen dy A S A.
05.03.1997: 06.06.2007:	Transferred to Bahamas registry. Broken up at Chittagong, Bangladesh.
