11.01.1860:	Launched.
09.04.1860:	Registered as <i>Massilia</i> for The Peninsular and Oriental Steam Navigation Company. Her engines were formerly installed in P&O's <i>Vectis</i> where they proved too powerful. Massilia was the Roman
	name for the southern French port now called Marseilles.
12.04.1860:	Maiden voyage Southampton/Alexandria/Southampton. Broke down homeward between Alexandria and Malta.
02.04.1866:	Port paddle wheel damaged when en route Malta/Alexandria.
03.04.1866:	Proceeded on starboard wheel only.
04.04.1866:	Arrived Alexandria.
05.09.1867:	Aground for two hours in the Solent inward bound from Alexandria.
16.12.1870:	On Alexandria/Brindisi service.
30.03.1873:	Passed through Suez Canal outward bound for Bombay. Thereafter Bombay/Far East services.
07.1877:	Sold for £8,151 to Yubin Kisen Mitsubishi Kaisha, Japan and renamed <i>Atago Maru.</i>
1885:	Sold to Nippon Yusen Kaisha, Japan.
1889:	Reduced to a hulk at Nagasaki.
1896:	Sold to Butterfield and Swire for use as a storeship at Chefoo. No further details.

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
