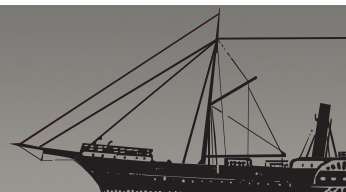

1963: Sold to Cia de Nav Bayano SA, Panama, and renamed *Uje*.
22.09.1973: Gutted by fire which broke out in her engineroom whilst she was lying at Antwerp.
23.10.1973: Sold to Spanish shipbreakers and arrived in tow at Bilbao to be broken up by Remasa.
