1864: 1865:	Ordered by the Australasian Steam Navigation Co Ltd. Completed and sold to the Anchor Shipping & Foundry Ltd.
1883:	Collided with the <i>Tui</i> at Wanganui, NZ.
1898:	In a collision with the <i>Felicity</i> at Motueka, NZ.
1899:	Collided with the <i>Dingadee</i> .
1900:	In a collision with the <i>Taieri</i> at Buller.
01.07.1917:	Takeover of the Union Steam Ship Company of New Zealand (Anchor Shipping & Foundry their subsidiary) by The Peninsular and Oriental Steam Navigation Company agreed.
1919:	Sold to Manawatu Shipping Co Ltd (Levin & Co, Wellington, managers).
1929:	Dismantled and the hull towed to Wairau River mouth to form breakwater in December of that year.

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
