	Fleet, being based at Manus in a largely stationary role.
07.1946:	Returned to commercial service at Bangkok.
11.06.1951:	Sold for £45,000 to the Heap Eng Moh Steamship Company Ltd,
	Singapore, and renamed Giang Bee.
1960:	Sold to Cathay Shipping Corporation, Panama, and renamed Kim
	Hwa.
1964:	Sold to Cia de Nav Santos, Panama, who renamed her Romeo and
	then Sinoe.
1966:	Reverted to Romeo with the same owners.
1966:	Sold to King Line SA, Panama, and renamed King Horse.
