- 06.02.1946: Launched.
- 12.06.1946: Completed as *Knebworth* for the Grand Union (Shipping) Company Ltd (a General Steam Navigation Company subsidiary company).
- 1960: Sold to the Limerick Steamship Company Ltd, Limerick, and renamed *Dromineer*.
- 1964: Sold to Harold B Dawe Ltd, St John's, Newfoundland, Canada and renamed *Domino Run*.
- 1974: Sold to Domino Run Steamship Company Ltd, Piraeus, Greece, but registered in Georgetown, Cayman Islands.
- 1979: Renamed *Mino* although no owner recorded.
- 04.1998: Deleted by Lloyd's Register as continued existence in doubt. Reported as being seized at Tripoli in January 1979, and was probably broken up locally in the 1980s.

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
