15.09.1890:	Launched.
05.11.1890:	Registered as <i>Virawa</i> for British India Steam Navigation Company at a cost of £59,600.
09.1891:	Grounded on Dungale Rock near Thursday Island. At first it was feared that salvage might be difficult but eventually she was refloated with the aid of the <i>Jelunga</i> and brought down to Sydney for repairs.
n.d.:	She was at times employed in the Fiji trade, carrying indentured workers for the sugar trade to and from Calcutta.
1896:	Served as a transport in the second Suakin expedition.
04.10.1898:	Collided with and sank the 64-ton schooner <i>Bessie Maud</i> when she came across her bows in Newcastle harbour, NSW. She was there loading coal intended for Colombo. The <i>Virawa</i> was undamaged and the subsequent enquiry held the schooner's master soley to blame for the incident.
07.1901:	Had a machinery breakdown in the Bay of Bengal and was towed into port by the <i>City of Athens</i> .
08.1905:	Ran aground on Tobin Cay in the Great Northeast Channel but was refloated with little damage.
24.06.1914:	Takeover of British India Steam Navigation Company by The Peninsular and Oriental Steam Navigation Company agreed.
12.05.1921:	Sold for Rs 82,000 for demolition at Bombay.

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
