26.01.1910:	Purchased by The Peninsular and Oriental Steam Navigation Company for £30,441 as part of Blue Anchor Line business.
20.07.1910:	First P&O sailing after refit.
04.1913:	Sold for £23,267 to Goshi Kaisha Kishimoto Shokwa, Japan, and renamed <i>Kwanto Maru.</i>
1917:	Sold to the French Government and renamed <i>Le Myre de Villiers</i> .
1919:	Sold to Brabant et Pruvost, France.
1923:	Sold to S Bertorello, Italy, for demolition.
23.04.1925:	Work was finally completed at Spezia.

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
