14.09.1970:	Sold to the British India Steam Navigation Company Ltd, London.
01.10.1971:	Management transferred to P&O General Cargo Division.
09.05.1972:	Sold through Mitsui and Co Ltd, London, to Tung Cheng Steel Corporation, Taiwan, for demolition.
22.07.1972:	Demolition commenced at Kaohsiung.
