Launched.
Delivered as <i>Discovery Bay</i> for the Peninsular and Oriental Steam Navigation Company.
Deadweight now 28,800 tons.
Rescued the crew of 10 of the Danish ship <i>Gudrun Kansas</i> who were forced to abandon ship in heavy weather in the Bay of Biscay after her timber cargo shifted.
The (then) largest container ship to call at an Arabian port in the Gulf, on the P&O Strath/Ellerman/United Arab Shipping Co joint venture Arabian Peninsular Container Line.
Ownership and management transferred to Overseas Containers Ltd. Deadweight now 29,262 tonnes.
Sent to be re-engined by Govan Shipbuilders Ltd, Glasgow with Burmeister & Wain diesel engine manufactured by Harland & Wolff Ltd, Belfast.
Redelivered. Speed 18 knots, 18,400 bhp. Tonnages now 26,757 grt, 29,288 tonnes deadweight.
Re-measured 27,823 gt, 11,259 nt.
P&O acquired full control of Overseas Containers Ltd.
Owners restyled P&O Containers Ltd.
Renamed <i>Direct Kea</i> for charter to Australia New Zealand Direct Line and employment on Australia and New Zealand/US West Coast service.
Transferred from P&O Containers Ltd to P&O Steam Navigation Company and immediately sold to Overseas Equipment Company Ltd, Vanuatu.
Broken up at Alang, India.

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
