10.12.1898:	Launched as <i>Pavia</i> .
18.03.1899:	Delivered as <i>Graf Waldersee</i> for Hamburg Amerikanische Paketvaart AG.
28.03.1919:	Surrendered to the United States Government and employed under US Naval control on trans-Atlantic repatriation duties.
12.06.1919:	Collided with <i>Redondo</i> 160km (100 miles) off Sandy Hook, New York. She was beached on Long Island and refloated on the 14 th .
11.1919:	Transferred to the British Shipping Controller (The Peninsular and Oriental Steam Navigation Company, managers).
14.12.1919:	Suffered a fire in the Hudson River.
04.12.1920:	Broke adrift when under tow up the Thames.
06.12.1920:	Broke adrift when under tow up the Thames, collided with the anchored <i>Tregantle</i> , with the anchored <i>Fairfield</i> , which capsized and sank, and with the hulk <i>Sumatra</i> . Eventually she grounded off of Gravesend.
08.12.1920:	Refloated and docked at Tilbury.
08.1921:	Sold to T W Ward Ltd.
05.1922:	Sold to Kohlbrand Werft, Hamburg, and scrapped.

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
